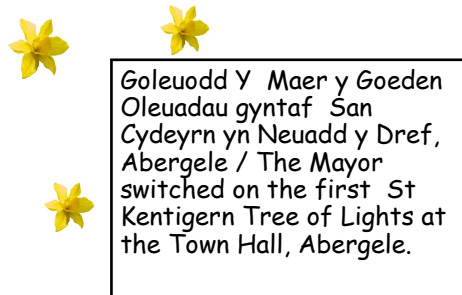

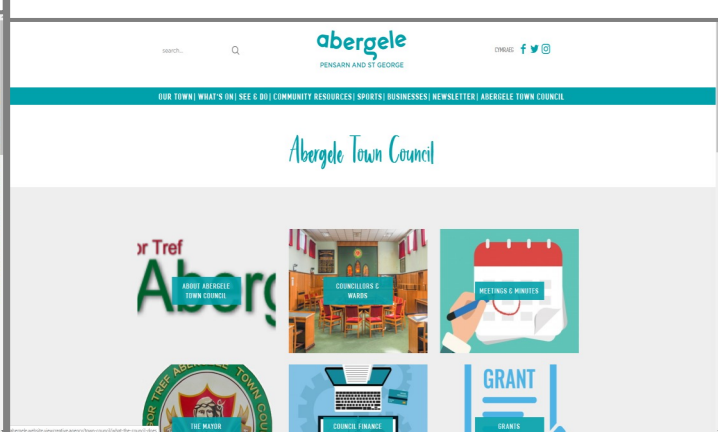
## Gwefan ABERGELE PENSARN Website

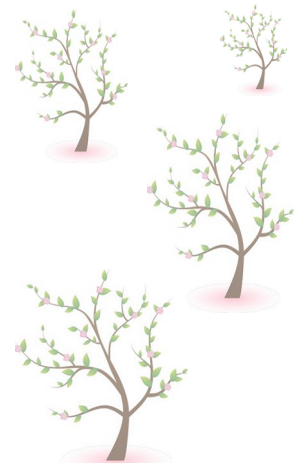

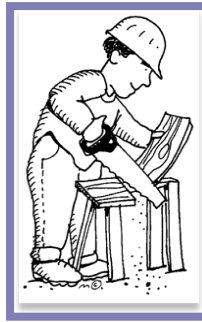

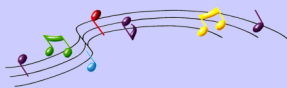
