

Active Travel



WHAT IS ACTIVE TRAVEL?

Active Travel means making everyday journeys by walking or cycling instead of using transport such as cars or buses. (The term "walking" includes using wheelchairs, mobility scooters and other mobility aids.)

It is a Welsh Government initiative to encourage healthier travel and reduce traffic congestion.

Active Travel includes journeys made to work, school, college, shops and leisure facilities. An Active Travel route has to connect to these places and be suitable for everyday journeys. Active Travel does not cover routes that are only used for leisure or recreational purposes.

CCBC launched a public consultation on Active Travel routes in Conwy County earlier this year. They wanted to find out where the residents of the County would like to see better facilities for walking and cycling and to understand what stops people from using routes at the moment

The information provided by residents and stakeholders will be used to update the Integrated Network Map, which shows future Active Travel routes. These can be brand new routes or existing pavements and roads which can be improved to Active Travel guidance standards.

There will be a consultation on the revised Integrated Network Map before we submit it to Welsh Government in December 2021.





Transport for Wales rejuvenate space at

Abergele & Pensarn Station

Transport For Wales (TFW) have recently undertaken a programme of works at Abergele & Pensarn Station as part of their Social and Commercial Development plan (SCDP).

The aim of the SCDP is to transform selected Stations into vibrant hubs providing contemporary facilities and services, inspiring pride in the local railway and fully integrating them into communities, with the objectives to generate additional activity at stations by maximising the use of space for community and commercial purposes to bring economic benefits and encourage cohesive communities.

Work started at the station back in Nov 2020 with works aiming to be complete by late summer 2021. The rejuvenation of spaces includes the former ticket office, the building on platform 1 and some rooms on platform 2. We are excited that a local charity will be

moving into the rejuvenated spaces on Platform 1 and 2.

TFW are passionate about connecting our communities to their railways. At Abergele & Pensarn Station we are committed to enhancing our station environment to compliment the building renovation work with additional planters and a community garden to follow.





Canolfan Dewi Sant, Pensarn

The Team at Canolfan Dewi Sant Centre are continually working hard to ensure the Centre remains fully Covid-Secure. At the time of writing this article, CDSC is open for the groups which involve activities that are allowable under the current guidance.

Abergele Camera Club





