Hi All,

5A.

Thanks for keeping me in the loop on these emails, so much to catch up on since returning to the office yesterday following leave and meetings in Cardiff on Monday.

In response to Cllr Alan's latest email in the thread, I can't take any credit for the detailed response or confirming the sources of spend, I merely passed on the enquiry to James as I was out of the office.

To respond on the points in the initial emails below, starting with the initial email enquiry from Cllr Luckock,

1. *Please could you report the specific details of all section 106 funding spent in Abergel, Pensarn, Belgrano in the last five years.*

As mentioned by James in his response, Richard Clarke is the Section 106 and Community Infrastructure Levy Officer who leads on this and will be able to provide a response once he's in a position to do so.

2. *Please could you also send me the scoring criteria used for Place Plan Projects in Abergel and the actual scores for all Projects including those that were not approved. As you know I have specifically written to you in the past about this on more than one occasion and have not received the information. I am minded requesting Internal Audit at CCBC to investigate this. This information should in my view be in the public domain.*

Apologies that you don't feel you've had a response to this question previously. The original request was via an email sent to a number of recipients and as the scoring process was carried out by the Town Council/Place Plan committee I thought the request might have been dealt with in-house so to speak. During 2018 a number of meetings were held by the Town Council and Place plan committee to discuss the Place Plan projects and which ones should be made a priority. This process was led by these groups and not CCBC. As a community engagement officer I strongly believe it is for the local members, residents and businesses of a town to determine their own priorities, I do not believe it is within my gift to complete this process but happy to support it. I have attached a number of minutes and agendas where the process was discussed at meeting of the town council and Place Plan committee. **If you feel that these projects or priorities are no longer relevant then I would suggest this is raised at the Place Plan committee for them to determine whether a review is required.** (see attached documents, these documents are owned by the Town Council and Place Plan Committee and not CCBC)

3. *Further please could you send me the up-to-date risk assessment for the Green Gele Project. As you know many people are deeply concerned about the project management of this scheme and risk of the Welsh Government allocation of funding not being spent by the Welsh Government deadline.*

The Green Gele project falls under the Abergel Regeneration Programme Board and is currently being discussed with WG following our discussions with the Place plan committee and their reservations regarding the new proposed solution for a stand-alone community hub now the sports pavilion is no longer a consideration. It must be stressed here that the risks to spend and alternative options have only arisen since the sports pavilion made the decision not to progress in line with the original funding application and delivery profile submitted to Welsh Government. The key issue here is that the sports pavilion would have been in a position to undertake the long term maintenance. As you know we were only made aware of this situation a few weeks ago and we have worked with WG to discuss a

proposal which was well received by the Regeneration Programme Board and then presented to the Place Plan committee as a concept design. Given the Place Plan committee's reservations we now find ourselves in a position where the project is under significant risk and are discussing remaining options given the ENRaW criteria has a minimum spend threshold of £500k which we may no longer reach with a scheme that just concentrates on improvements to the planting and green land. As you will appreciate the predominant project spend would have been on the improvements to the sports pavilion.

The risk and issues log will be forwarded upon further discussions with Welsh Government including issues regarding alternative options and long term maintenance costs. We will, of course, keep you posted on developments following these discussions.

Morning all

Shane has passed this through.

Just to clarify – the football pitch spend came from the Planning Policy Core Budget to save time initially and not from 106. We wanted to get the work started ASAP, so used core budget to avoid initially seeking agreement of s106 spend in line with the protocol.

The intention is to draw down the 106 money for the football pitch at a later date, which would need agreement of the Place Plan as per the processes in the Section 106 Protocol. This work should not really be financed through a core budget, so I would expect the Place Plan Board to be supportive of such a community based/recreational space piece of work.

Richard Clarke is the Section 106 and Community Infrastructure Levy Officer who leads on this. Richard is currently reviewing the S106 Spend Protocol, which went to our Committees Working Group a couple of weeks ago. The Protocol will be going through the political process for sign-off. I can confirm that the Place Plan would remain key to signing off any Section 106 as per the current protocol.

I would suggest you waiting for Rich to complete the new spend protocol and present to the ATC at an appropriate time.

Land ownership issues - @ Pentre Mawr

- See Plan attached identifying part of the park edged red – this area is subject to a Restrictive Covenant which may cause issues.
 - Perhaps just best avoiding this area . . .
 - No issues, as per a Legal Report on Title, for the remainder of the park.
 - Just some interests to be aware of - rugby pavilion lease, 1 x documented sub-station, some underground gas pipework close to the Awel y Mor site.

Amongst other issues – Planning will be something to consider from the start also. Notably when the House is G2 listed and park may well be considered curtilage.


Project summaries



Public conveniences – Worked with committee members and staff from ATC and CCBC to design appropriate layout for the reopening of Pentre Mawr Facility. Provided regular updates on progress. Oversaw and reported to committee on redesign of Water St and Pensarn Beach facilities.

Regeneration board – Attended meetings as part of the project officer's board. Provided community based updates and created links to projects on the ground. Provided feedback on visual and sustainable elements of proposed Gateway development. Requested regular updates on Traffic management scheme. Attended a number of meetings with regards to the maintenance issues at Pensarn flats. Proposed a Play street initiative to address fly tipping issue.

Waymarkers – Reviewed condition of pathways around Abergelie. Created 3 themed circular routes, with maps and points of cultural and historical interest. Designed maps and Roundels to printing standard and prepared information for transfer to website. Created QR Code and integrated into project to provide further information and links through Abergelie website.










Town Signage - Facilitated the conclusion of the Brown signs project.


Football Club – Facilitated the inclusion of new football pitch onto Place Plan Priority list.



Findings from the report were implemented within the social media channels to great success. Engagement with Town Council work has gone up by every measurable factor. This has resulted in the public been far more aware of the work ongoing and with a simple method to consult with, receive feedback and grow support and engagement with the projects. This template can now be utilised to action changes to the website to create a more user friendly space that functions as an information hub for the town.

Menter Iaith – Engaged with and promoted the work of Heli Blod to businesses around Abergel. Helped to develop and promote the ideas for welsh language events throughout Abergel including gigs, lessons, play days, and bilingual pub quiz. 

The Mount – Engaged with contractor and CADW assess site issues. Reviewed project and provided analysis on feasibility of development.


Town Council Planters – Provided a report on the condition of the planters and planting, with detailed recommendations for their improvement in line with biodiversity and sustainability aims.

Green Energy Assessments – Successful grant application that has funded independent energy assessments for community buildings in Abergele, Pensarn and St George. These assessments are helping community groups to lower energy use in their buildings, which is both a financial and environmental positive.






St George's School – Hosted a few garden design and grow your own sessions with the school groups. Collaborated on a nature friendly garden design which we are sourcing funding for currently.

Abergele in Bloom – Received a request for assistance in creating an In Bloom group. Collating ideas for group projects and promoting through social media channels.









Project Summaries


Abergel District Action Group – Attended a number of meetings and helped with the hosting of annual event Shakespeare in the Park.



Project Ownership and capacity to deliver

- First 2 columns indicate the main leader on projects. 1/3 to 2/3 split is reasonable and gives us scope to direct change.
 - 3rd column (pink) 22/38 projects could have active community involvement, over the past year this community involvement has grown but significant officer time is required to truly engage and in the right cases hand over projects to the community.
 - The final column indicates our current ability to deliver projects as a Town Council. Simple processes like accounts with firms, payment cards, storage areas, and volunteer numbers need to be developed to deliver the scale of projects on the list.

Initial meetings were arranged to fit into busy calendar of meetings.


Reverted back to 6:45pm meetings for second round. Lack of confirmed attendees led to all 3 groups being cancelled.

- Increase frequency of Place Plan Committee meetings in place of working group meetings (i.e. Monthly)


