Hi Mandy

Extending the deadline could present problems. There are several elements to this scheme, but these consultations about the proposed parking restrictions and traffic calming features must be concluded in a timely manner to ensure we do not miss our window to employ a contractor to begin works outside the schools during the summer holidays. The construction works to the shared footpath/ cycleway along Ffordd Y Morfa would cause least disruption to the public if it is undertaken during the school holidays.

The first five plans, which I understand to be those named 'TRO Abergele plans' do not have a key and purely serve as a visual aide to the Traffic Regulation Order Notice 1, which describes the sections of road that would be affected by the parking restrictions, those locations are

I can confirm that Sea Road will have a level crossing place for pedestrians. The proposal is not to drop the kerbs, but to raise the level of the road, which will improve the view for pedestrians of any oncoming traffic and make pedestrians more prominent.

Please see below 'zoomed -in' section of the plan. You will also see there are proposals to create a new access to Pentre Mawr Park in line with that crossing place.

I have also been instructed to confirm if the drop curb modification request on Sea Road is included in the plans? Vic Turner and Andrew Wilkinson have both confirmed that this would be included by email to Cllr. George Frost on the 03/03/21 and 05/11/21 - copy of the responses to Cllr. Frost are included below.





I refer to the above details. An appeal has been made to the Planning Inspectorate against the decision of Conwy County Borough Council. The appeal follows a refusal of planning permission by CCBC (Local Planning Authority).

The reasons for the Council's decision are:

The proposed first floor extension would be a top heavy incongruous introduction to the existing property and would constitute overdevelopment of the site to the detriment of the character of the street scene and of neighbouring dwellings. The proposal will therefore be contrary to Policies DP/3, DP/4 and DP/6 of the Conwy Local Development Plan 2013, relevant sections of Planning Policy Wales, 11th Edition, February 2021 and sections of the Householder Design Guide, adopted February 2014.

The appeal will be determined on the basis of **Written Representations**. The procedure to be followed is set out in Part 3 of the Town and Country Planning (Referred Applications and Appeals Procedure) (Wales) Regulations 2017.

As this appeal is a **Householder Appeal**, with the exception of the grounds of appeal the matter will be determined only on the basis of the information submitted to us and there is no opportunity for you to submit comments at this stage. However, if you submitted a comment to us we will send it together with all the representations made to us on the application to the Planning Inspectorate and the appellant. These will be considered by the Inspector when determining the appeal. However, if you wish to withdraw any comments you made at application stage, it must be received by the Planning Inspectorate 4 weeks after the start date of the appeal (see above).

A copy of the Planning Inspectorate's leaflet 'A Guide to Engaging with the Planning Inspectorate Wales' can be obtained either free of charge from this office or through the Welsh Government website https://gov.wales/planning-appeals-guidance.

Requirement

- To be acknowledged as exceptional by their peers and colleagues;
- Where possible, to have made some kind of wider contribution beyond the requirements of their position, long service is not enough on its own to merit an award;
- May have an honour already and have continued to make an exceptional contribution over and above that previously recognised.
- May have received an award or wider recognition for their role already.
- May undertake community or voluntary service in addition to their career.
- Genuinely added value to Wales, either in their local communities or by raising the profile of Wales internationally.

As well as general nominations, we are seeking nominations specifically relating to the Queen's Birthday 2022 themes which are, disability awareness work, climate change or environmentalism and COVID-19.

We are also looking for candidates who have made a major impact in delivering key priorities of the First Minister of Wales. Nominations from all protected groups, including women, disabled people and people from ethnic minority communities are particularly encouraged.

Could you also please consider suitable candidates earlier within their careers, rather than at retirement age. Nominations should be made whilst the nominee is still active. Retired candidates who are successful have to be within 12 months of their retirement date at the

Confidentiality and Quality Assurance

It is, of course, important that you have appropriate quality assurance processes in place within your organisation. In preparing your nominations, it is reasonable to ask other people for information about the candidate, but it is essential that all enquiries are handled in strict confidence and in no circumstances should the nominee be told that they are under consideration for an honour. The need for discretion when making enquiries which may be necessary is particularly important.

If something of an adverse nature comes to light after you have made the nomination please inform us immediately. We should also be informed if you hear of any changes which affect the nominee e.g. change of address, new appointment, retirement, serious health problems or death.

I attach a guide to honours nominations 'Honouring Outstanding People'. This explains the honours process in more detail including level descriptors, advice on how to complete the citation template and examples of citations and how these should be written. I have also attached a new version of the citation template which also includes information required about ethnicity to be completed for each nomination to the best of your knowledge.

When writing a citation the focus must be on the impact and outcome this person has had. If you are nominating a large number of individuals, we ask that you clearly indicate a priority order. Any nomination that doesn't included impact, outcomes or priority order (if relevant) will not be considered.

Central Action

Once nominations have been received, internal Government sifts will take place and if successful the nomination will be sent to the relevant central UK Honours committee for the final decision. Please note, this process in total can take a number of months.
