i. A grant application has been made for funding for two EV chargers in Water St carpark. (Progress currently stalled due to COVID)





vi. Installed a number of picnic tables and benches made from recycled materials for vii. Funded a 4 way recycling bin on Pensarn Prom Penke Mcw Pole the enjoyment of the public in the town.

i. Committed to purchasing Fairtrade tea, coffee and sugar for refreshments

#### 5. The Environment and Nature Pledge

Achieved:

- i. Increase in biodiversity by installing 8 planters at various locations in the town
- ii. Increased biodiversity by installing 26 hanging baskets every year for 16 weeks
- iii. Increased biodiversity by installing a butterfly and bee garden in Pentre Mawr Park
- iv. Extended bio-diversity by installing a further 8 flower planters made from recycled materials in the town centre
- v. Purchased 'A' boards for the Promenade and Pentre Mawr Park which provide equipment to encourage passers-by to do a quick 2 minute litter pick on the beach or in the park (National Scheme #2minutebeachclean)
