Good afternoon,

Island Green Power (IGP) would like to inform you of our proposals for a solar and battery storage project on land near Bodelwyddan.

There are two elements to the proposal:

- A solar farm which is proposed on land at Rhuddlan Road, to the northwest of Bodelwyddan; and
- a battery energy storage system (BESS) which proposed on land adjacent to the west of Bodelwyddan substation, south of St Asaph Business Park.

The two elements of the project would be connected by an underground cable (approximately 5 kilometres in length) to the grid connection point at Bodelwyddan substation.

The Bodelwyddan Solar and Energy Storage Project will provide a source of renewable energy, helping to reduce carbon emissions and contribute to Wales' net-zero goals. It is estimated that the solar project could save up to 35,569 tonnes of CO2 per year and generate up to 110 megawatts (MW) of electricity, which is equivalent to providing enough power to meet the annual electricity demands of 26,657 homes.

The BESS would store up to 110MW of electricity during times of high renewable energy generation (such as solar and wind) and discharge it when demand is high or renewable generation is low.

Due to the scale of the proposed project, it is classed as a Development of National Significance (DNS) and a planning application will be submitted to the Planning Environment Decisions Wales (PEDW) for determination by Welsh Ministers.

IGP specialises in the development of utility-scale solar and BESS projects with a mission to increase solar energy usage, making more renewable energy possible whilst drastically reducing carbon emissions. Over the last decade IGP has successfully delivered over 34 projects worldwide totalling more than one gigawatt of clean, renewable energy assets.

IGP is committed to working with the community to develop the proposals, and an earlyengagement community consultation will take place in early 2025. This will provide an opportunity for local residents and businesses to learn more about the project, ask questions, and provide feedback. After this early engagement consultation, a formal Preapplication Consultation (PAC) process will be undertaken.



- Bodelwyddan Solar & Energy Storage Limited is part of Island Green Power.
- Since 2013, we have become a leading developer of utility-scale solar projects and battery storage systems. We have successfully delivered over 34 solar projects worldwide with more than IGW of energy capacity. This includes 17 in the UK and Ireland.
- In November 2022, Welsh Ministers granted consent for our 30MW Brynrhyd Solar Farm in Carmarthenshire which, once constructed, will generate enough renewable energy for over 10,600 homes a year.

Project overview

 Bodelwyddan Solar & Energy Storage will consist of a solar farm with a 110MW export connection and a battery storage (BESS) site with a 110 MW import connection.

 The two sites are separate but will be connected via underground cables, the route of which is currently being refined.

- The point of connection is **Bodelwyddan**substation (proposed to be extended by National Grid) which is adjacent to the BESS site.
- Grid connection date -October 2029/2030.

There is an existing solar farm in the southern section of the site which has been operational since 2015.





According to our soil surveys, over 95% of the site is in on Grade 3b or below agricultural land and as such is not farmed as BMV land.







The Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS) site is located on Land adjacent to the west of Bodelwyddan substation, south of St Asaph Business Park.




The BESS will be able to store up to 110MW of electricity during times of high renewable energy generation (such as solar and wind) and discharge it when demand is high or renewable generation is low.

The site is located on Grade 3b and below agricultural land (not BMV).

The BESS will be connected to the solar site by circa 5km of cabling. The cable route is yet to be determined, with assessments still ongoing.





Please find attached final copies of last year's Annual report for your members please.

At some of the recent control room visits it was suggested I forward a simple list of our services – so please also see below.

Conwy CCTV currently provide and support

- A secure state of art unit (NSI approved) for partners to use for resilience, 100% IP with up to date technology and room for expansion.
- 24/7 manned live CCTV support for NWP with live video images to JCC and audio Airwaves links HD
 quality images.
- 24/7 manned live CCTV support for other agencies (NWFRS,BTP etc)



- Internal requests for live monitoring from departments E.G. Social Services vulnerable persons / safeguarding requests etc.
- Flood monitoring
- Interrogation of video for North Wales on request instantly (24/7) and usually responded to within hours (not days)
- Live uploads to Police using secure portals avoiding the need for officers to travel to collect video.
- Town Link Radio Scheme
- In house support for enforcement officers using mobile and radio support.
- In house support for enforcement officers on Dog Patrols and environmental issues with live monitoring on hotspots.
- Management of 12 new 'Hotspot' mobile CCTV cameras for monitoring environmental and ASB issues.
- Building camera surveillance live links as a community benefit e.g. Coed Pella reception direct to JCC. School buildings out of hours incase of ASB e.g. youths on roof etc?
- Single Point of Contact on Surveillance Systems across Conwy County to ensure compliance with GDPR and Data Protection, best price and integration, specification issues etc.

INTRODUCTION

This Annual Report is published by Conwy County Borough Council in accordance with the CCTV Code of Practice for the operation and management of the system.

Conwy County Borough Council, North Wales Police, partners and business organisations remain of the view that CCTV will reduce incidents of crime and public disorder where cameras are either in place or are introduced. It also assists in traffic management and improves community confidence, thereby creating a safer environment for residents, traders, tourists and visitors alike.

The main objectives of the Camera System can be summarised as:

- Assist in the detection, prevention and fear of crime.
- Facilitate the apprehension and prosecution of offenders in relation to crime and public order.
- Provide residents, visitors and businesses with a greater feeling of safety and security. (Specifically in relation to Corporate Plan Priority 5/ Safety)
- To enhance community safety, boost the economy and encourage greater use of the town centre/shopping mall, etc.
- To assist with traffic management.
- To assist the Local Authority in its enforcement and regulatory function. (Specifically in relation to Corporate Plan Priority 1/ The Environment)

CORPORATE PLAN OUTCOMES

In the main the Public Space Surveillance Camera Department contributes towards the Conwy Corporate Plan 2022-2027 with regard to priority area 5, but with the use of strategically positioned cameras it also has an impact on addressing some significant cross cutting themes throughout the plan as below;

Locations of CCTV Cameras - Conwy County Borough Council

An annual review of existing camera locations and their justification has been completed and a Data Impact Privacy Assessment (DPIA) is available on request as recommended by the Surveillance Camera Code of Practice 2021 amended version Surveillance Camera Code of Practice and as set out in the Data Protection Act 2018 and the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) to ensure compliance with the requirements of the Protection of Freedoms Act 2012.

For our CCTV review, Conwy Council compile evidence on 8 factors to assist with determining if each individual camera is necessary and proportionate, the results of which are entered into a scoring matrix which highlight the lowest scoring cameras. The factors considered are as follows:-

- NWP Crime in Area of CCTV Cameras
- CCTV Incidents
- Fit for purpose
- Fibre Rental and associated running costs
- · LoS (Line of Sight) future proofing e.g. location suitable for wireless.
- Financial Contributions
- Operator Opinion
- Public Reassurance

Camera count in April 2023 was 118 in total spread over 19 towns within the county.

No cameras were decommissioned during 2023-24 due to scoring being much improved following the reduction of associated running costs (cancelling of fibre circuits), full use of Line of Sight technology and secured financial contributions from Town & Community Councils in areas where Public Space CCTV is deployed.

REDEPLOYABLE CCTV

There are no re-deployable or mobile cameras owned by the CCTV Department suitable for relocating around Conwy County in this financial year. There is a recognised need for this service and funding has now been found via the UKSPF Shared Prosperity Fund in a bid to bridge this gap (see news section)

March 2024 saw the successful bid for a group of cameras using funding from round 5 of Safer Streets, these were deployed in and around 6 locations in the Glyn Ward However these cameras can only be relocated from within Colwyn Bay / Glyn Ward as per criteria of grant funding, costs are supported for a 5 year term.

THE CONTROL ROOM

There have been no major changes to the new control room, it remains 100% IP enabled (Internet Protocol) so connected via Conwy Network and built to the required specification for an Alarm Receiving Centre (ARC). All the security systems installed and measures taken to ensure compliance with this intended stream of income have now been tested and have been signed off by auditors from an assessing body named the National Security Inspectorate (NSI) who provide the accreditation. External Audits are undertaken going forward by NSI every 6 months.

The control room hardware and cameras are fully covered by maintenance contracts of a 'Gold Cover' standard, this ensures any failure of equipment/ hardware, including cameras is covered with a full replacement within the term of contract.



STAFFING

No change to permanent staffing numbers, remaining at 6 part time and 1 full time manager. This is a skeleton staff providing one operator only on shift at any one time with limited resilience for sickness etc, work is progressing via UKSPF Grant Funding (see News) to increase these staffing numbers, in a bid to generate more income.

All Staff are licensed by the Security Industry Authority (SIA) and all staff have passed Non Police Personnel Vetting, this is a requirement to enable us to continue using the North Wales Police airwave radios.

NEWS

March 2023, a bid for UK Shared Prosperity Funding (UKSPF) also referred to as 'Levelling Up' funding was submitted, the final application was titled *Better Open Spaces management*, education and environmental interventions through CCTV service enhancement. The bid had a total value of approx. £470K towards staffing and mobile cameras, mainly to assist in reducing environmental crime e.g. fly tipping, littering, dog fouling, and dog control orders etc. but the proposal is also focussed on future proofing the service by increasing income and providing resilience for the Public Space CCTV Cameras.

August 2023, the bid was granted with access to the funding early September, when we kick started the first strand with a recruitment campaign, 8 successful applications (6 CCTV Operators and 2 Environmental Officers) started in post November 2023 and entered an intensive training programme to include vetting and SIA Licensing. Having these additional staff members allows us to double the staff in control room at all times which in turn allows us to compete in the commercial market and bring in new business in regard to monitoring Fire, Intruder and CCTV Systems in the private market. These grant funded posts are funded until Dec 2024

End of year March 2024, saw headway on second strand of UKSPF project with the procurement of a group of 12 mobile cameras to be deployed in 'hotspot' areas.


March 2024, a bid was submitted for bringing in Live monitoring for all Denbighshire Public Space Cameras including Rhyl, Rhuddlan and Prestatyn.

March 2024, also saw the completion of the 2nd round of Safer Street funding for additional mobile cameras in the Glyn Ward which met criteria like Porth Eirias beach area. We also invested in some new hardware through this fund which has allowed us to start experimenting with Artificial Intelligence (AI) However active use of features like Facial Recognition are <u>not</u> being activated due to data protection reasons but having the AI allows interrogation of video to be much faster and more efficient.


STATISTICS 2023-24

The following statistics detail the number of CCTV incidents recorded by CCTV Operators. There were 6998 CCTV incidents last year, 756 of these incidents relate to site monitoring, 4084 were sourced from North Wales Police. CCTV incidents are not necessarily recorded crime, e.g. an operator monitors a dog fouling and passes information to an Environmental Enforcement Officer or a Pubwatch Radio Link User requests CCTV to monitor a drunk male, CCTV then requests police to attend and suitable advice only is given by officers with no further action.


Incidents by Source

BUDGET

We have completed the CCTV Digital Upgrade Project. This was a 5 year spend to save plan which commenced 01/04/2018 and will realise annual savings of £80k by end of project term from the cancellation of fibre rental. Capital financing costs for the project were being paid back at the approximate cost of £58,200 annually.

The 2024 annual cost per camera to the service is £2540 based on 118 cameras.






