This message came from outside your organization.

Dear Abergele Town Council,

I am contacting you regarding the news I have received that the Abergele Community Centre will not be taking bookings after 29th September while it undergoes an assets review from the council.

This is very disappointing news as our Church, Lighthouse Baptist Church, meets in the community centre, three times a week for services and has met there for over twenty years. This year we have also been running a warm welcome scheme on a Tuesday afternoon. We also have other meetings during the year such as a recent drama evening and our Christmas carol service which are attended by the wider community. During this time our Pastor, Joe Nicholson, has also acted as a caretaker during interim periods when there was no employed caretaker.

Our Church has approximately 30 people who meet on a Sunday morning and the community centre provides an ideal location for our church to meet. The community centre is in a central location which helps attract people to the church who are passing. It also has several rooms which are large enough to accommodate our congregation as well as adjoining rooms which are suitable for the Sunday school. We usually have 8-10 children (under twelves) in the Sunday school. The community centre also provides storage facilities for the church. This is used to store several large and valuable items, a projector and screen, an electric piano and a lecturn, as well as other items such as hymn books, tea cups, and Sunday school resources. People coming to the Church are able to use the car park behind the library which makes access safe for several of our elderly members who have reduced mobility.

The council suggested several other locations where we might be able to meet, but each of these has difficulties. Many do not have an adjacent room for a creche and Sunday school, others do not have storage space, few have such good car parking and not all have access for disabled people.

I believe our church makes a valuable contribution to the local community but also that the town of Abergele will suffer greatly if this central community space in town is lost.

Many thanks for your time in considering this important local issue and please could you keep me informed of any future developments about the community centre.

As your Members will be aware, Conwy County Borough Council has indicated that it intends to close and dispose of the Abergele Youth and Community Centre for financial reasons.

Given that the building is an important part of the town's heritage and that it occupies an important location in the town centre I am keen to see the building retained as a publicly accessible community asset for future generations to enjoy.

Having discussed the matter today at length with ClIr Charlie McCoubrey in his capacity as Leader of Conwy County Borough Council I believe that the Town Council should give urgent consideration to taking on the building to safeguard its future.

I appreciate that Members will want to consider the financial implications of such a decision and that this may require the relocation and disposal of your current property but I would encourage you to explore these options as soon as possible in order not to miss the opportunity to acquire a unique civic building which will be closer to the heart of the town.

Mandy,

Thank you for your email.

The intention is that a report will be presented to Cabinet in mid-October setting out options for the above Council asset, following Youth Services resolving to decommission it as a Council managed facility.

The report will include the option that the Council places the asset on the open market and seeks proposals; those proposals may be conditional on matters such as planning, survey, finance etc. There is nothing preventing a community group or even Abergele Town Council coming forward with a proposal, which could then be measured against what other proposal(s) come forward. If a deliverable proposal comes forward which is at less than market value, it will then be a further Member decision if that proposal is the one which the Council decides to proceed with.

Depending on the nature of the proposals that come forward, the property will be empty and managed by the Council's Facilities Management team as a Vacant Building at Risk. The Grade II listed nature of the asset will shape an element of that management regime. Due to its listed status, as things stand, demolition is not an option.

Gele Park – Timber edgings in and MoT Type 1 hardcore laid on southern/straight path. Hardcore in process of being compacted. Note that southern edge of path (left hand side of photo) does not quite align with edge of wall opening as intended. This should not be an issue provided a min. clearance of 1.5m provided in all directions as part of chicane fence install.

Gele Park – MoT Type 1 Hardcore installed along southern/straight path. Crossfall of path discussed – will be to the north (toward the left side of the photo). Noted that some localized adjustments to soil levels along path edge will be needed to make sure that surface water can run-off into grassed area.

Gele Park – Junction of southern/straight path with existing path through park. Contractor confirmed that existing tarmac edge would be cut to create a neat finish and levels tied in.

Gele Park – Tactile paving delivered to site. Noted that this is the incorrect type – blister paving, rather than corduroy. This was raised with Contractor following visit and has been replaced with the correct paving flags.



Gele Park – Heras fencing in place and no security issues reported.



Gele Park – Junction of northern/curved path with existing path through park. Noted that timber edgings are sitting too high to enable smooth tie in. Height of timber to be adjusted to suit.



Gele Park – Northern/curved path link. Compacted MoT Type 1 hardcore in place along northern/curved path link. As with southern path, need to ensure cross-fall established and that surface water can run-off into grassed area unimpeded.

Background & Information

Abergele Men's Shed is a not for profit Charity registered with the Charity Commission serving the Abergele, Pensarn and Llandulas area. The charitable purpose and primary value of the Men's Shed is to promote social inclusion for men who may be vulnerable or lonely by providing activities and a safe place to meet. Abergele Men's Shed is one of 84 Men's Sheds in Wales. Every Men's Shed is different and reflects the interest and skills of its members. In Abergele the current focus is on woodworking, domestic repair and recycling. It receives donations of materials and equipment to support these activities. In time it is envisaged the range and scope of the activities can develop and expand depending on a suitable premise. It does not charge for its services but receives commissions and donations to support its costs.

The Men's Shed started Abergele in 2016 in a wooden shed on a café car park with 6 members. In 2020 the café was sold and its equipment had to be moved to a steel container. During the first period of the COVID pandemic lockdown a permanent premise was sought. After much negotiation a dilapidated building at the rear of 35 Market Street was purchased from the Crown Estates. Planning consent was granted to become a multi-purpose community hub.

In the interim between lockdown and refurbishing the Market Street premises, a temporary location was set up in the former St. Michael's Church Hall, Groes Lwyd, now in private ownership. Here activities expanded, membership grew and a parallel She Shed was set up. The She Shed has recently formed its own committee but remains under the Men's Shed charitable banner for the time being. Currently, both Men's and She Sheds are relocating to the Worsley Wear site at the end of High Street as this provides more space and is more suited to the activities, albeit at a higher rental cost.

In order to refurbish the site in Market Street a National Lottery Development Grant Of £126,000 was awarded. This allows plans and tenders to be drawn up to enable us to apply for a Lottery Capital grant, anticipated in the region of £500,000. Plans, designs, specification and tender work is nearly complete and the Lottery application will be submitted in the next few weeks.

The refurbished building will comprise 2 storeys; with a workshop, craft area and relaxation area at ground floor. The first floor will be open plan, multi-use for a range of community activities and meetings for up to 35 people. The building will be fully compliant for disabled access. Situated immediately off Market Street the activity will increase foot-fall in the town centre.

In the past few months a number of consultation events have taken place with the community. Local businesses have also been kept aware of the plans. There has been fantastic support and interest in the project.

I hope you are well.

I would very much appreciate a letter of support please in your capacity as a Place Plan coordinator using your knowledge of the local area and levels of deprivation etc.

I have the opportunity of applying for a grant from the Community Regeneration Key Fund which is part of the UK Government Leveling up grant. It is being administered by CVSC.

As you know we have operated the Abergele District Foodbank for 10 years and have for some time planned to establish a community larder. This is a good opportunity to buy equipment and run our pilot scheme over the next 12 months.

This will be a good opportunity to help low income families that don't necessarily need a food parcel to access affordable food and you know as well as anybody that the need is great in this area. Not only does a scheme of this kind restore dignity but it also combats food waste.
